Our Executive Director

We are delighted to share some exciting news and accomplishments from The Alex House Project (TAHP) as we continue our mission to uplift and support young families in our community.

We are officially moved into our new space at 9 Bond St, Brooklyn, NY. This central location allows us to provide more accessible services to our young parents. Our recent open house was a resounding success, giving community members and partners a glimpse of our new space (currently under construction and soon to be transformed into a warm and inviting environment).

Awards and Achievements: We were honored to receive the Brooklyn Communities Collaborative Maternal Health Initiative Grant of \$167,311. This grant enables us to continue providing essential resources such as career opportunities, comprehensive doula services, mental health support, case management, and psychotherapy/education sessions. Additionally, we were recognized for our commitment to serving the community as a Spark Prize finalist in 2024. Finally, our Casino Night fundraising event, generously sponsored by Assisting Women through Action Resources and Education (AWARE), raised \$35,000 to support our mission further.

We are hiring three doulas, specifically for our young parents, as part of an 18-month commitment program. Due to the overwhelming interest, we are conducting a three-stage application process.

Participant Success Story: We are thrilled to congratulate Nyja Robbins, one of our 2017 graduates and former Parent Educator and Alex House Project Ambassador, on becoming our in-house case manager! Nyja's journey exemplifies the transformative power of TAHP's programs.

Introducing Mark Damien: In August, Mark Damien joined us as Development Manager. Partnering with Director Samora Coles, Mark's expertise drives TAHP's Advancement Plan to cultivate robust donor relationships. He manages fundraising efforts and explores innovative opportunities to secure resources, and create new revenue streams.

Welcoming New Board Members: We are excited to welcome Tiffany Perkins, Fiara Sealy, and Lauren Howard to our board. Their valuable contributions will undoubtedly strengthen our efforts to serve our community.

Parent Educator Program Expansion: We have hired two new Parent Educator Fellows who have begun their two-year internships. These individuals, who have completed our program, will help us extend our mission to new incoming moms.

Social Care Network Expansion: Our partnership with the Social Care Network allows us to offer health screenings and referrals across the five boroughs, ensuring more young families receive essential services.

We are immensely grateful for your continued support. You have been instrumental in helping us grow and make a positive difference in the lives of young families. We look forward to sharing more exciting updates as The Alex House Project continues to expand its impact.

The Alex House Project (TAHP) is a peer-led organization that empowers young and expecting parents in Brooklyn. Our focus lies in expanding access to parenting training, higher education, and employment opportunities to improve the long-term self-sufficiency of families, within New York City.

Our Community At TAHP, we foster a supportive community of parents working together towards common goals. Our organization is committed to addressing the needs of marginalized young parents in vulnerable situations, including those experiencing homelessness, members if the LGBTQ+ community, individuals in immigrant communities, and those involved in foster care. We serve our young parents with dedication and compassion, striving to improve their lives across all five boroughs of New York City.

We collaborate with mother-and-child group homes, family foster care, domestic violence shelters, and various community-based organizations and government-funded institutions to offer crucial services and accept referrals for those in need. Through these efforts, we create lasting, positive change in the lives of young parents and their children.

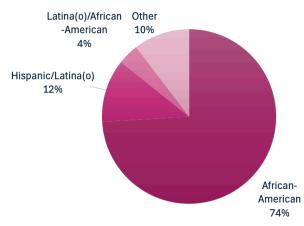
Our Approach

At TAHP, we integrate parenting programs, supportive services, employment assistance, and leadership development initiatives to create a wide range of opportunities for our community members. This holistic approach provides young parents with the skills, resources, and confidence they need to thrive.

Holistic Parenting Class "Parenting Journey": Our 8-week program guides parents and caregivers in exploring how past experiences and current circumstances impact their parenting styles and beliefs, ultimately shaping their interactions with their children. Upon completing the course, participants receive a Certificate of Completion is recognized by both the courts and the Administration for Children's Services. The certification further validates their dedication to personal growth and responsible parenting.

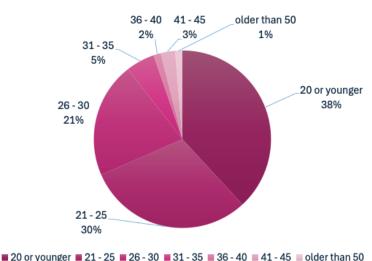
Demographics

Ethnicity

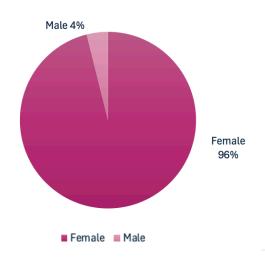

Leadership Development: The Train the Trainer (TTT) program is a biannual opportunity exclusively for parents who have completed our Holistic Parenting class. Chosen participants engage in a two-year paid internship with TAHP, gaining valuable professional development and training. This comprehensive experience prepares them for future roles as Parent Educator Fellows and, ultimately, Parent Educators within our organization.

Employment assistance: Upon finishing their two-year internship with TAHP, Parent Educators work closely with an Employment Coordinator, receiving tailored guidance and training before being referred to external job opportunities. Once they secure employment, TAHP provides an additional \$15 per hour for 90 days, totaling 15 hours per week or 30 hours bi-weekly, supplementing their earned salary.

Supportive Services: TAHP collaborates with <u>Delgracia Corp</u> to offer social-emotional support for all participants through access to Social Workers or Social Work interns. Additionally, our partnership with <u>SUNY ATTAIN</u> enables us to provide referrals for high school equivalency (HSE) services, helping our community members further their education and pursue growth opportunities.

Housing Assistance Pilot Program: Under Executive Director Samora Coles' leadership, TAHP has introduced a program to help participants with valid housing vouchers secure appropriate housing. The program collaborates with local realtors and landlords who accept different housing vouchers to ensure a smooth matchmaking process. Furthermore, TAHP offers assistance with the necessary paperwork, guiding families through the housing application process.

Progressively Deepening Gains Through Ongoing Engagement

2024 Overall Results:

- 108 participants completed parenting training, received certificates, and participated in various program activities. They networked with other parents and accessed necessary support services.
- 53 participants remained active for multiple years, showing increased self-worth, self-care, parenting skills, and education and employment readiness.
- 131 more participant experienced significant changes in personal and family outcomes, including improvements in family stability, employment, education, housing, and child development.

Ripples of Empowerment

The lasting influence of our program reaches far and wide, touching the lives of many beyond those who complete the course. Here are a few ways others continue to benefit:

Continued Growth:

23 alumni remain connected, reporting sustained success in their personal and family lives.

Benefits of Connection:

131 participants, unable to complete the full parenting curriculum, still gained valuable knowledge and support by attending select classes. They also received information, referrals and employment support from our dedicated Employment Coordinator.

Essential Services Provided:

52 participants received vital assistance, support, referrals, and housing aid to help them navigate life's challenges more effectively.

By offering flexible and tailored assistance, our program positively impacts a wide range of individuals, creating a lasting legacy of empowerment and growth.

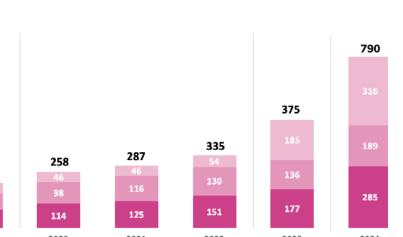

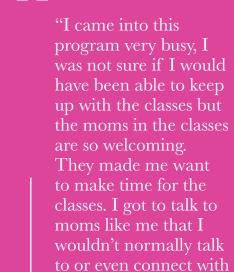
